

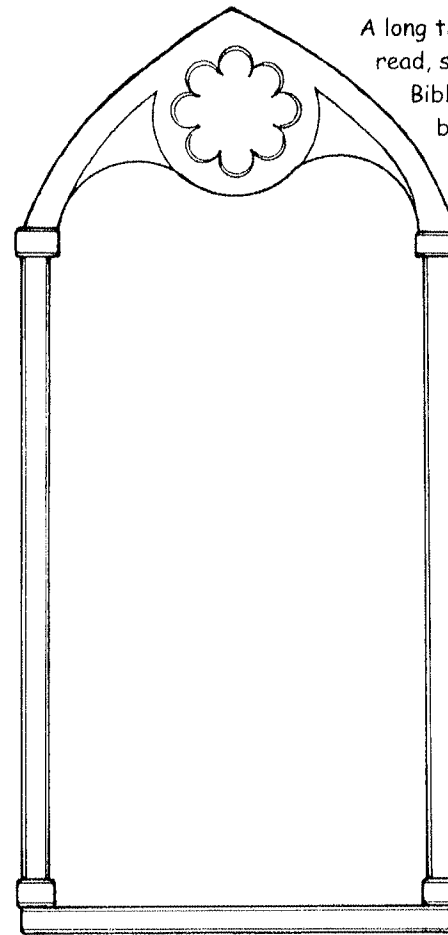

STAINED GLASS PICTURES

A long time ago, very few people knew how to read, so they couldn't read the stories in the Bible. When cathedrals and churches were built, the windows were designed to tell some of these stories by using pieces of colored glass to create pictures. People who came to church could learn about Jesus by looking at the pictures in the stained glass windows, even if they couldn't read.

Does your church have stained glass windows? Do you notice how beautiful they look when the sun shines through them? Do you have any favorite windows?

Choose a window that you really like. Draw a picture of what you see in this space. When you get home, draw the picture of the church window on a piece of tracing paper or very thin white paper. Color it with crayons or markers. You can also cut up little pieces of colored tissue paper and glue them to the paper. Hang your picture on the window and see if it reminds you of the stained glass windows in church.
