

The famous Russian novelist Fyodor Dostoyevsky said, "Love action is a harsh and dreadful thing." In the Gospel reading t week, Jesus does something harsh and dreadful — he watches own disciples abandon him. What could possibly be loving abo that?

Well, we notice the context is Jesus' teaching about eating a drinking his body and blood. His followers hear this and say, "T teaching is difficult; who can accept it?" (John 6:60). We should imagine we'd do anything different, because not even the ones w stay, like Peter, seem to understand what Jesus is saying. Then hear this devastating line, "Because of this many of his discip turned back and no longer went about with him" (John 6:6 Besides the night of the Last Supper, only now do Jesus' discip abandon him. And, painfully, Jesus just lets them go.

The best way to make sense out of this is love. Jesus is God's love action. He wants to become one with those whom He loves. wants to love them as His own body. Yes, the oneness manifested the Eucharist sounds harsh and dreadful because it is rooted in lo which is willing to risk abandonment and separation to attain goal: to be one body with the beloved. It is both terrifying a wonderful that Jesus will risk losing us in order to be one with Our response? Lord, we cannot grasp a love so great, but plea help us never to abandon it, either.
